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Parsley Hay – Biggin - Hartington

Start: Parsley Hay Cycle Hire Car Park SK17 0DG Finish: Biggin, SK17 0DH Afternoon walk: Hartington, SK17 0AL	<p>Blow the cobwebs away in the Peak District. This walk starts off gently then takes us through impressive gorges. It's spectacular without being hard work! The highlights for both groups are the village of Hartington, Wolfscote Dale and Biggin Dale.</p> <p>Group A Go NW a short distance then take footpath SW. Continue through fields. At signpost turn S to Hartington, as indicated. Continue S through village into Beresford Dale and Wolfscote Dale. Turn NE through Biggin Dale and up to Biggin, via Dale Head. About 9 miles</p> <p>Group B Circular. Start Biggin. Drop down through Biggin Dale, turn into Wolfscote Dale to Hartington. Return to Biggin and pub. About 7 miles</p>
Afternoon	Track NW to Hartington About 2.5 miles

Start: A: East Garforth Primary School LS25 5AT B: Micklefield Primary School, LS25 4AQ Finish: Saxton, LS24 9PY Afternoon walk: Towton	<p>Easy walking through a beautiful and historically important landscape. The Battle of Towton (1461) was the largest and bloodiest battle of the War of the Roses. It secured the English throne for Edward IV . (www.britannica.com)</p> <p>Group A Head NE towards Hazelwood Castle then S to Lead Hall Farm and Lead Church. Take footpath E to Saxton About 10.5 miles</p> <p>Group B Head NE across the A1 then N up to Lotherton Hall for coffee break. Continue through grounds to Lotherton Lodge and take Lotherton Lane to Aberford. Follow footpath North out of Aberford over footbridge crossing A1 then follow the Cock Beck to Lead Hall Farm and Lead Church. Take footpath East to Saxton pub and lunch.</p>
Afternoon	A guided tour of Towton Battlefield. About 2 miles

Pheasant Inn, phone 01969622223, Post Code DL8 5PA	<p>Group A and B Start at Akebar Farm and head South to Spruce Gill Farm and then West into Finghall. Continue South past Thornton Steward Reservoir and onto Thornton Steward. Head West through Denby Grange to Denby Hall and Ulshaw.</p> <p>Group A From Ullshaw, cross the River Ure to Cover Bridge and follow the North Side of River Cover to Cover Scar. Turn N to Middleham Castle, head NW out of Middleham on Park Lane to Sharp Hill Farm and take the Bridleway to Middleham Bridge. Cross the River Ure and follow the footpath to Harmby. Approx 9 miles</p> <p>Group B At Ulshaw take to the footpath Nort West to Wood Lane, Onto Spennithorne and Harmby Approx 7 miles.</p>

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Afternoon	Take one of a selection of footpaths to Leyburn.

Morning Post Codes TBC Muston YO14 0EL Filey Filey YO14 9FD	<p>Group A Start at Muston, Carr Lane TA 100 798 follow the footpaths around to Manor Farm. Cross the A1039 and follow bridleway to South to Stockendale Farm and into Stockendale. Approx 9 miles</p> <p>Group B Start at Folkton, Grange Farm, head South past Folkton Woods Farm and Join the Yorkshire Wolds Way down Camp Dale to Stocking Dale. From Stockendale Groups A and B follow the same route. Follow the Centenary Way to Hunmanby, Take the footpath to the Royal Oak. Crossing on the A165, follow footpath to Lowfield Farm, Muston Grange and into Filey Approx 7.5 miles.</p>

Morning	<p>This high moorland makes you feel like you are on top of the world. Groups A and B start at the same place, with a steady climb, then a steady descent to a great pub. Due to inaccessibility, there is a half mile walk from the pub to the bus, and this is included in the overall distance</p> <p>Both groups cross the moors westwards to Ogden Water</p> <p>Group A From Ogden Water continue north to Nabb Hill. Follow Warley Moor Reservoir SE to Knoll Hill then cross Warley Moor in a southerly direction to Sleepy Low. Descend south-east to The Cat I' Well. After your pint make your way to the bus at The Crossroads Inn.</p> <p>Group B Drop down to Ogden Water and walk eastern shore to the inlet stream. Take White Wall End NE then head SW to Sleepy Low. Descend SE to The Cat I Well. After your pint make your way to the bus at The Crossroads Inn. Approx 7 miles</p>
Afternoon	The afternoon walk explores Luddenden Dean and ends at The Crossroads Inn. 3 miles

Walk through the village and leave via the footpath near Hartendale Farm to Danes Dyke for a second coffee and sandwich break. Follow footpath through the golf course to Sowerby, then onto coast heading west to Bridlington for Christmas Lunch at the Marine Bar.</p>
